About the project: The [#KU_WWI Twitter Project](#) is a Twitter-based reenactment of the assassination of Archduke Franz Ferdinand in Sarajevo. This historical event, which occurred on June 28, 1914, is often cited as the initial geopolitical event that resulted in the [#FirstWorldWar](#).



Tweets created at the Call for Tweeter events will form a Master Script, which will tweet-out live on June 28, 2014.
